### From Fr. Totton's Desk

### Corpus Christi - It's not just a town in Texas!

In fact, the city of Corpus Christi, TX takes it's name from the venerable Feast we celebrate today - the *Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord* (rendered in Latin: "*Corpus Christi*" which means "The Body of Christ"). In the history of the Church, this feast was established rather late (in the mid thirteenth century) but centers on a mystery so central to our Faith that it dates to the night before Our Lord's Passion, when Jesus, at supper with his apostles, instituted the Sacrament of the Eucharist by which he nourishes us with his True Body and Blood in Holy Communion. This Feast provides us with a good opportunity to renew our Faith in the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. For we say we believe, but do our actions belie our purported belief? Below you will find a set of questions you might use to examine how well your actions coincide with you belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist:

- 1. When I enter the church, do I genuflect (if able) in adoration of Jesus' Presence in the tabernacle behind the altar?
- 2. Have I gone to confession recently to prepare my soul to welcome Our Lord who wishes to give Himself to me in Holy Communion?
- 3. Do I fast (from food including gum and drink, except water) for at least one hour prior to receiving Holy Communion? (\*this does not apply to those who are ill or infirm)
- 4. Do I show reverence in Church as a temple of God out of respect for Jesus' Divine Presence, and in order to allow others a quiet place for prayer and meditation?
- 5. Do I dress for Mass in the *same way* I would dress for a wedding or some other special occasion out of respect for Jesus' Presence in the Blessed Sacrament?
- 6. When receiving Holy Communion, do I make an act of reverence (profound bow or genuflection) immediately prior to receiving?
- 7. If receiving Holy Communion in the hand, are my hands clean?
- 8. After receiving Holy Communion do I use the time of silence to offer a prayer of Thanksgiving to God for His Gracious Gift?
- 9. Having acknowledged Jesus' Presence in the Eucharist, am I also able to recognize him in my brothers and sisters? In strangers?
- 10. Bonus Question: What other U.S. City (besides Corpus Christi) is named in honor of this Mystery of our Faith?\*

\*Sacramento, California is named for "The Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist".


