

From Fr. Totton's Desk

I have always been fascinated by the stories of Catholic converts - that is the means by which the Lord drew them into the fullness of the Faith in the Catholic Church. On occasion such stories involve a Catholic fiancée or spouse, sometimes they involve a child receiving Baptism or First Holy Communion, and sometimes, souls have been moved by the Hope of Eternal Life expressed by the Rite of Christian Burial. My overall favorite conversion story, however, involves three unlikely details: the military draft, boot camp and cigarettes! A good friend relates how, as a young man in the Vietnam era, he was subject to the draft, so he decided to enlist in the Marine Corps. Until that point, he had not been a member of any established church, though, like many of his contemporaries, he identified as "Christian". In boot camp the recruits were subject to rigorous conditions to prepare them for the challenge of combat - which was a near certainty for young Marines in those days. Sunday was the one day when they could spend a few hours in worship and classes in which they were not at the mercy of the drill instructor, *if* they chose to attend chapel services. My friend had gotten word that the Catholic chaplain allowed the recruits attending his instruction classes to smoke cigarettes and drink ("soda") pop. He reasoned that it might be nice to spend an hour or two in a more relaxed setting where he could smoke cigarettes and enjoy a cold pop, so he opted to attend Sunday Mass and the instructions offered by the Catholic chaplain. Reasoning that he would likely be sent into combat, and that he might meet his maker sooner rather than later, he thought he should probably make a spiritual commitment and he liked what he was learning about the Catholic Faith, so he elected to become Catholic before shipping out to Vietnam. His Catholic Faith became dearer to him than he ever imagined, and after the war, he continued to practice his new Faith which he eventually went on to share with his wife and their children (and grandchildren).

That story brought a smile to my face when I was a young seminarian, and I must have filed it away somewhere. My friend's witness, and that of many other veterans as well as active duty military personnel, has always inspired a certain sense of admiration for those who answer a call to serve our nation which is self-sacrificial, and not unlike the call to Christian discipleship. I have long felt called to serve our Lord while serving alongside men and women who have dedicated themselves to the service of our nation in the defense of freedom. For that reason, about a year ago, I approached Bishop Johnston to seek his permission that I might apply to become a chaplain in the Navy Reserve. After a period of prayerful discernment, he gave his blessing and I began the rather lengthy application process several months ago. On Monday I received word that I have been selected to become a chaplain in the Navy Reserve. Many have asked how this will affect my current assignment at St. Ann and St. Joseph Parishes. As a reservist, I will be required to complete some initial training. After that I will drill monthly with a local reserve unit (Navy or USMC) and attend annual training while continuing my civilian duties which include the administration of these two parishes. Periodic absences may require me to find substitute priests to cover Masses here from time to time, but I will continue to serve faithfully as your priest even as I seek to provide pastoral and sacramental care to those in uniform.

More details will follow as more information becomes available. In the meantime, please pray for all who serve our nation in the defense of freedom.






