Dear Friends in Christ,

Happy and Blessed Easter to you and yours!

As we encounter the Risen Lord this Sunday, He gives us hope. In the coming weeks, we will also see how this mystery of our Faith cofounds even the Apostles and Evangelists who struggle to explain what they are witnessing—Jesus' glorified body. Any of us who are still present here have never experienced the glory of the Lord. And when we confess the "resurrection of the body" in the creed every Sunday, we mean to say that this will happen to us as well who are in union with God. It means that the soul's natural habitat is the particular body to which it belongs. It means that death as experienced by us in the fallen world is reversed by the cross so that we are promised a physical immortality with no pain or ability to sin anymore.

This is the freedom that is offered in the cross and by extension the resurrection of the Lord. By spending an entire 40 days in self-denial, we are supposed to now be rightly ordered, a foretaste of what resurrected life will be like. As we join in this joyous occasion, let us remember that death has no power over us. Our Lord Jesus Christ lives and has destroyed sin, death and Satan. May we live this season with Christian joy!
