### From the Pastor's Pen...

### Spring is in the air!

I never cease to be impressed by the coming of this season, as the temperatures rise and the snows begin to melt (and melt and MELT...!) This year is a bit surreal with Easter coming as late as it is — By the way, the Date of Easter is moveable based on the lunar calendar — It is always the Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox (first day of Spring) and is tied loosely to the Jewish celebration of the Passover! Nevertheless, the birds begin to sing, and the trees begin to bud and the flowers begin to bloom...okay, I would have been a failure as a writer for Hallmark! Still, I enjoy taking a deep breath and going out for a long run! Additionally, I am excited to see another type of Springtime in the Parish!

The life of any parish (or set of parishes) seems to go through a cycle like that of the year (though the timing may be different). It was with some melancholy that I reflected on the fact that, between our two parishes, we had 14 funerals over the last year! Fourteen souls commended to the Mercy of God – and other additional deaths among the family and friends of our various parishioners. It felt like a late Autumn. Now, however, we begin to see new signs of life in our parishes. I would like to reflect on a few of them:

Two weeks ago, seven of our youth (from St. Joseph Parish) received the Sacrament of Confirmation along with many others from around the St. Joseph area when Bishop Johnston came to Cathedral to bestow this sacrament by which they were equipped to assume the role of spiritual warriors emboldened to proclaim Christ by their words and actions;

Last Saturday, I was privileged to witness the marriage of St. Ann's parishioners **Mindy** (**Beall**) and **Eric Whitlow**! Congratulations to them and to their families! Over the next several months there are several more weddings scheduled to take place here or elsewhere involving our parishioners! This is a sure sign of hope, for it portends an openness to God's Grace in a special way through the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony! In many cases, it also points to the potential for new life, and the Abundant Life that is bestowed in the gift of Baptism – but perhaps I am getting ahead of myself! Nevertheless, it is life-giving to witness the life-giving witness of husband and wife who stand before the Lord and invite Him to elevate their love for one another to an icon which reveals the tremendous love of Jesus for His bride, the Church!;

On Wednesday evening (April 3), there was an informational meeting to consider the formation of a parish-based troop for fathers and sons to provide for Catholic spiritual formation in the context of adventure and life-skills. Two dads (one from St. Joseph and one from St. Ann's) approached me about this some months ago indicating that they wanted to form such a troop in our area. Based on the scouting movement founded over 100 years ago by Lord Baden Powell, this troop will carry on a long legacy of forming boys into young men, but with a clear identity in Christ and a connection with our parishes. 
