

Dear Friends of Christ

Jesus today tells us that He is the Bread of Life. This would have been very familiar sounding vocabulary to the Lord's Jewish listeners. We learn in the Book of Exodus how the Israelites complained vociferously against God for saving them. They weren't saved in the way THEY wanted. He was leading them to the Promise Land and teaching them, and yet, they wanted to go back to the place of sin, death and slavery for some familiar food. We do this all of the time in life when we lament where we are, what we supposedly used to have when we lived another lifestyle and there can be longing for sin. The test in the desert is to stay the course, to arrive in the True Promise Land which is Paradise, the Heavenly Jerusalem.

.... In the Temple, the Jewish people kept twelve loaves of the Presence to represent the 12 tribes of Israel and God's Presence in the Temple. Once a year, the high priest would appear and show these to the people and say, "Behold, the Bread of the Face." God's Presence was often called His Face in the Hebrew language. It is now, that what foreshadowed the Eucharistic Presence is about to become a reality. Will we walk away as well with a lack of faith? Or will we believe the words of Christ?
