Dear Friends in Christ,

In today's Gospel, we hear that "many of His disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer followed Him." We hear a lot of talk about the notion of "encounter" today. But a true and authentic encounter with Christ that is not centered on ourselves necessarily means that we acquiesce to the Word of God and stay. It's not as if we can "be friends" with Christ and boldly not follow His Word. The teaching on the Eucharist is a hard teaching. Only the Catholic and Apostolic Church (and schismatic Churches with origins in the Apostles) maintain it. Everyone else has "walked away." How many other teachings of Christ that are difficult are we tempted to walk away from and "return to our former way of life"? A true encounter with the Lord means that we want to convert, that is, turn toward Him and not backwards.
