Dear Friends in Christ,

Quid pro quo. I do this for you, and in exchange, you do that. Jesus talks about the Christian spirit of magnanimity or enlargement of the soul. It is a virtue that is related to the concept of Christian joy. Quid pro quo thinking is when we expect something in return from our giving. In other words, it is conditioned giving. It is calculated. It is the kind that frankly many of us are used to. Yet, when Jesus gives His command about this topic, that is precisely why He tells His listeners to invite people who cannot repay us. It is in this way that one's intention is perfected and honed not on what we receive in this life, but rather is properly ordered toward the supernatural virtue of charity. Charity has God as our final end. It is different than simply kindness or being nice. It is ordering our daily actions toward our final end for which we were made—union with the Blessed Trinity.
