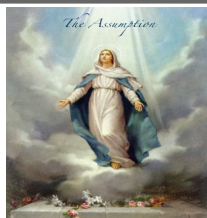

Dear Friends in Christ,

The weeds will grow and choke any sort of desire to grow in holiness.

Let us stay awake, even during these last warm months, yearning and waiting for the coming of the Kingdom and boldly announcing that same Kingdom to those in our time.
