Dear Friends in Christ,

As Elijah wanders about and is fed miraculously from God, so the Hebrews also wandered about generations before. And at the moment of their displeasure and desperation, they were fed miraculously by the hand of God Himself. In the New Dispensation, it is God Who gives us the gift of Himself to eat. No longer is it miraculous natural food, but now the substance of bread and wine cease to exist and are only under the appearances of bread and wine. The substance is God Himself. As the Word became Flesh and "pitched His tent or tabernacle among us," our own parish church contains His Real Presence among us. While God is transcendent, He makes Himself imminent or physically among us, His people, the new Israel, the Church. As we approach to receive the True Bread from Heaven, it is good and praiseworthy to remember the way in which we receive Him. I would like to remind people that the normative way in the Church to receive Holy Communion since the early middle ages, if not earlier, is for the priest, the representative of Christ, to feed the communicant the Body and Blood of the Lord. It is not to feed ourselves, for we must be utterly dependent upon God. Although there is an "indult" or permission in the United States to receive Communion in one's hand, we should not be confused historically—this is an innovation. Receiving Holy Communion in one's hand in the early Church was not done in this way—early Christians would've never received Holy Communion in their left hands, but rather would've put their right hands up to their mouths making sure that none of the "pearls" as the Coptic Church calls the fragments were left or discarded. Learning about the Bread from Heaven gives us pause to think of the way in which we receive Holy Communion. Because the pos-1970s Church permits Holy Communion in the hand in the United States and instructs one on how to receive this way, I ask that if you choose to receive Communion this way, we do so correctly. Please place your left hand over your right flat so that I can place the host on your hands. Your hands must be clean as well. I have watched several "pop" the Host in their mouths as regular food or manhandle it with fragments being most likely lost. This is the Bread from Heaven. We show our belief (or lack thereof) in the way in which we receive the Lord. Let us be attentive and approach the sanctuary of the Lord where He appears to feed us with His Body and Blood.
