From Fr. Totton's Desk

Several years ago, after Mass where this Gospel passage was proclaimed, a parishioner stopped me and said that this parable should have been "an excellent opportunity for Jesus to encourage His disciples to share!" I was more than a little surprised at her boldness to presume to suggest that Jesus got it wrong! That's not to say that sharing isn't important - in fact, in multiple passages, the Lord encourages us to share, but that was clearly not the point He was trying to illustrate in this parable. Rather, He seems to emphasize the need to be vigilant, watchful, and the fact that each of us will be held responsible on a personal level, not merely as members of a collective group! The image of a lamp to be trimmed and maintained recalls the Light of Christ with which we are entrusted beginning at our Baptism. When you and I were baptized, we received a small candle, lit from the Easter Candle, with the exhortation: Receive the Light of Christ, this light entrusted to you to be kept burning brightly, so that when the Lord comes, you might go out to meet Him with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom. The Light of Christ is the Grace given us so that we might share in God's very life! It's a gift freely given, but one which, if it is to remain burning, we must take care to maintain it. This is symbolized by the oil mentioned in the parable. When we are younger, our parents and godparents help to shield that light from the contrary winds of the culture, and from the wiles of the devil. As we grow older, and assume more responsibility for our own discipleship, we must implement safeguards: weekly Mass; a regular life of prayer; observance of the moral law; an authentic Christian discipleship on every front, to keep the flame of faith alive in our hearts. Sometimes, we are overwhelmed by the winds, or we neglect to see that our flask has extra oil, and the flame goes out, but even there, the Lord gives us the means of rekindling that fire through Sacramental Confession, and returning to His Love, even as we await His final coming. We can, and we should, rely upon the help of others to bolster us in our commitment to Christ, but at the end of the day, the Lord will call us, as individuals, to account for the Light He entrusted to us. When the Lord comes, may we go out to meet him, our lamps burning brightly, that He may welcome us into the Wedding Feast of the Heavenly Banquet.

Last weekend was Navy Reserve drill weekend, and the sailors at NOSC (Naval Operations Support Center) Kansas City welcomed a special guest, **Rear Admiral Scott Jerabek**, the flag sponsor of our center. At the end of his short session with chiefs and officers, Admiral Jerabek asked each of us to express his gratitude to our families for your sacrifice in allowing us to serve in the Navy Reserve. You are my family, and I realize that it represents a sacrifice to welcome (and learn the idiosyncrasies of) visiting priests while I am away. I wanted to be sure to convey the admiral's gratitude and add my own as well. Finally, on this veteran's day weekend, I would like to express my own gratitude to those who have served (or are currently serving) our nation in the defense of Freedom.

Next Sunday, November 19, St. Ann's Parish will be hosting the annual Plattsburg Community Thanksgiving service in conjunction with the Plattsburg Ministerial Alliance. This year we will be trying something different. We will gather at 5pm in St. Ann's Hall at 5pm for a potluck dinner immediately followed by an informal thanksgiving service in the hall. Even if you have not attended in the past, I would encourage you to join us if you are able. This is one of the few times during the year when the churches of Plattsburg gather together in a worshipful way. Since we are hosting, I hope we can provide a good turnout to welcome our neighbors.

Finally, for your planning purposes, I will celebrate Mass on Thanksgiving Morning, **Thursday, November 23** at **9am at St. Joseph Parish in Easton.** Last year I offered the Mass on Thanksgiving at St. Ann in Plattsburg. Since I cannot be in two places at one time, I hope to rotate this on an annual basis. I welcome parishioners from both parishes to join us for this special Mass.




