### Sacramental Theology and "Low Gluten" v. "Gluten Free"

A recent clarification from the Vatican on valid matter for Holy Communion has been causing a general stir in the news lately. And though I have gotten no specific feedback, I thought this might be a good time to address the issue in our parish, more for clarity's sake than for instruction. Before I go any further, I would like to quickly review Sacramental theology.

Those of you who studied the Baltimore Catechism can probably recite the definition of a Sacrament by heart: A Sacrament is on outward sign, instituted by Christ to convey grace. Sacraments have form and matter. In other words, there are actions and sometimes words and some material reality. In the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, the form is what we commonly call the words of institution - Jesus' own words at the Last Supper, so at Mass, the priest, in the person of Christ, says, "This is my Body...This is the chalice of my Blood..." that is the form of the Sacrament of the Eucharist. The matter (or material) for the Sacrament of the Eucharist is bread and wine, more specifically wheat bread and grape wine. If the proper form (words of institution) is not used or if valid matter (wheat bread and grape wine) is not used, then there is no Sacrament, and the elements on the altar simply do not become the Body and Blood of Christ. This is very basic Catholic Sacramental Theology regarding the Eucharist. It is not new, it is not earth-shattering, it is what we have always held.

The confusion lately has to do with the use of low-gluten hosts for those who have been diagnosed with celiac disease. Over the past twenty years or so, medical doctors have identified a disorder whereby certain people's bodies are intolerant to gluten, a constituent chemical element found in wheat (and other grains). In some people the reaction is so severe that they even express concern about cross-contamination, and may not even eat from dishes washed in the same water as that used to wash dishes that have touched bread, though very few celiac patients present a reaction so severe. Nevertheless, for a host to be valid matter for the Eucharist, it must contain some gluten. The Benedictine Sisters of Perpetual Adoration at Clyde, MO have developed a low-gluten altar bread which has been approved as valid matter and is often used for Communion for those diagnosed with celiac. How safe are these hosts for celiac patients? According to a recent article in the Washington Post, "In 2004, Alessio Fasano, director of the Center for Celiac Research at the University of Maryland, said that one of the Benedictine Sisters' low-gluten wafers contained such low gluten that someone with celiac disease would have to consume 270 wafers daily to reach a danger point."

Some companies make and market *Gluten Free* communion breads (probably made from rice flour), but these are *not* valid matter and may not be used at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. In this regard, using proper language is extremely important because "low-gluten" and "gluten free" do not mean the same thing! This is the primary reason the Vatican issued this recent clarification. We have parishioners who have a *legitimate medical need* to severely limit the amount of gluten they may consume. Some of them receive low-gluten hosts at Holy Communion while others choose to forego the host and simply receive from the chalice - which is a legitimate - and practical - option, since the whole Risen Christ: Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity; is present under either species of Holy Communion.


