From Fr. Totton's Desk

When we lived in Detroit, every summer we would use my Dad's 2 weeks vacation from work to travel to Missouri in order to visit family. I remember on one such visit, over 30 years ago, we were staying with my aunt and uncle in Gladstone and early on a Saturday morning we drove down to Midtown Kansas City to take part in a prayer vigil. It was called a "Jericho walk", based on the actions of the Israelites under the leadership of Joshua as described in the Joshua 6:1-27. We circled the block seven times, praying and silently witnessing to the sanctity of human life. The focus of our prayer was the Planned Parenthood location at 47th and Harrison. We were there because, at that time, this was the primary abortion center in Kansas City, MO. From what I remember, our prayer vigil was peaceful, and it was composed of Catholics, other Christians, and various people of good will united by a belief that life begins at conception and that abortion is a great tragedy and a denial of that truth. There were others who were shouting at us and it was clear that we were not welcome there. At 9 or 10, I don't think I grasped the full impact and import of what we were doing, but it seemed clear to me that we were witnessing to the Truth. That prayer vigil, and my aunt's commitment to witness to the sanctity of life, left a lasting impact on me.

At least since 1997, I have been aware that the first Sunday of October is designated as Respect Life Sunday. That year, some upperclassmen at Conception Seminary invited me to join them in Maryville for a "Life Chain"! I asked, "are there abortions happening in Maryville?" They explained to me that abortion impacts people, men, women and children, in all our communities regardless of where abortions take place! That makes sense. So we went, we stood along a stretch of Maryville's main drag, held signs of witness and prayed for about an hour. I did this each year I was a student there, and have gone to similar events many times over the last twenty years - sometimes it is chilly and sometimes it is unseasonably warm and sultry, sometimes the weather is pleasant even if the reaction of some passersby is less so! This afternoon I hope to join in the Walk for Life in St. Joseph. (Details on inside page)

There are many life issues in our current culture which call for our serious reflection and witness, including questions about euthanasia, certain reproductive "technologies", and even the legitimacy of capital punishment. At the heart of all of these, though, is the basic right to life beginning with the unborn. In recent years, the pro-life movement has come to a greater appreciation of the need to provide: alternatives to abortion; compassionate care for post-abortive mothers (and fathers); and above all, an emphasis on praying for the conversion of the hearts of all. *All of these* are important aspects of seeking to truly witness to the Sanctity of Life and the Dignity of the Human Person.
