From Fr. Totton's Desk

One of the greatest joys of my priesthood is to be an instrument of God's Mercy, especially in the Sacrament of Confession. To date, I have expanded confession times in all my previous assignments and, in time, the faithful have responded by opening their hearts to the Mercy of God by availing themselves of the added opportunity to seek absolution and forgiveness. When I arrived at St. Ann and St. Joseph, I also arrived at a dilemma: How to serve two parishes with a short window between Sunday Masses and be totally and completely present to meet the needs of each parish. That challenge is particularly sharp on Sunday mornings as the scheduled "9:30" confession time is the most popular among the faithful. Still, I find myself literally rushing to get there in time, and then rushing to attend to the patiently awaiting penitents. On many a Sunday morning, I lament the lack of opportunity to prepare and become more recollected prior to the 10am Mass. Whether this is evident or not, it has taken a toll on my own desire that Mass be a prayerful experience for both the priest and the lay Faithful. For that reason, I have decided to discontinue Sunday morning confessions at St. Ann (I will still maintain confessions before Mass at St. Joseph in Easton) in order to allow for a more prayerful preparation for Sunday Mass. At the same time, I am expanding the time I hear confessions on Saturday afternoons at Plattsburg. I will now be available in the confessional beginning at 3pm on Saturday. I will also continue to hear confessions in Plattsburg on Tuesday evenings at 5:30pm.



Some say they will give up "Starbucks" coffee or children might give up candy for Lent - so the monies you would have spent should be put in your baby bottle.


Every time you add money to this little bottle, ask God how He would have you be a part of our outreach to bring hope and help to women and babies.
