# From Fr. Totton's Desk A Bishop on Baseball and Beauty!

One of my favorite seminary professors was a young priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago who often used to decry what he called "beige Catholicism"! He used this term to describe a faith which was typified by whitewashed monochromatic churches devoid of artwork (statues, paintings, etc.) and ornamentation, but he was commenting on more than the mere appearance of buildings, but rather upon the philosophy which undergirded such destructive designs and the consequences which often followed. This same professor - himself a brilliant student of St. Thomas Aquinas - rather preferred the age-old description of Catholic Christianity as a revelation of God - the Divine Being whom ancient philosophy and early Christianity described in terms of three adjectives: **The True**; **The Good**; and **The Beautiful!** These same three adjectives also describe three approaches to understanding the Faith. There are those who come to the Truth about God through an intellectual process and those who come encounter God through the observance of rules (do good, avoid evil). But my professor contended that the *vast majority of people* encounter God first and foremost through an experience of **Beauty**, and subsequently grow in their appreciation for **Goodness** (the moral life) and **Truth** (the intellectual life). A few years after I was ordained, my professor, *now* **Bishop Robert Barron**, went on to launch **Word on Fire Ministries**, an international media effort to evangelize through showcasing the beauty of Catholicism. About four years ago, Bishop Barron wrote a great essay on the role of beauty in bringing people to the Faith. With Baseball season fast approaching, I would like to share a portion of that essay for your consideration:

The pattern is more or less as follows: first the beautiful (how wonderful!), then the good (I want to participate!) and finally the true (now I understand!). A young man watches a skillfully played game of baseball, and it awakens in him a profound desire to play as well as those whom he admired; and then the actual playing of the game teaches him, from the inside, the rules and rhythms of baseball. A completely inadequate way of drawing a kid into the world of baseball would be to start with a clarification of the rules or with a set of drills. Rather, show him the beauty of baseball, and he will want to play, and having played, he will know.

After the service, you will be picked up at the door and returning to your car around 10:30 pm.


The cost will be \$8 to \$10, depending on the number of riders. If interested call your parish office 816-473-2011 to register by March 31st.
