#### From Fr. Totton's Desk

#### -All Saints...

Mindful that we observe a Holy Day of Obligation, the Feast of All Saints on Wednesday, November 1, please note the Mass times for St. Joseph in Easton - 6:30am and St. Ann in Plattsburg -6pm. *There will be no vigil Mass in Plattsburg or Easton on Tuesday evening*. Just an FYI: Masses for Our Lady of Guadalupe are 8 am and 6 pm. Parishioners unable to attend Mass during these times are encouraged to call other local parishes to inquire about Mass times for the Holy Day.

I have always enjoyed All Saints Day, but it wasn't until I went to seminary that I began to understand the connection between the secular customs of "Halloween" and the age-old religious observances of All Saints. The Seminary held an "All Hallows" party on the night of October 31 in which seminarians were encouraged to dress as saints! I have often encouraged my parishioners, especially those of a younger age, to do likewise. I realize that most families have already purchased costumes by this point, but it may be something to consider for next year! Dressing in the costumes of saints doesn't necessarily take the "fun" out of Halloween, but it gives this seemingly frivolous holiday a much deeper meaning, and can even be a means of evangelizing our neighbors! Additionally, due to the roll of martyrs, there is no shortage of costumes which might be gruesome or grotesque, if you are into that sort of thing (a decapitated John the Baptist, and barbecued St. Lawrence come immediately to mind!) In parishes and organizations where children (and even adults) HAVE dressed as saints. I have noticed that the project encourages them to research their saint in order to better understand how that person lived the Faith during their time in such a way as to grow in holiness, so as to become a Saint! Even if you don't have time to put together a costume, I would encourage all parishioners to use these days to do a little research on the lives of Saints whom you wish to emulate (it may be the saint whose name you bear, a patron of a particular cause dear to you, or maybe an unusual saint you've never heard of before!) You may begin your research on-line at www.catholic.org/saints/. Be mindful that the Saints lived this life facing many of the same challenges we face and possessing many of the same Graces we have been given. Each baptized Christian, is called to holiness, so as to enter into Heaven when we have completed this earthly life. Whether we are ever recognized as such by a formal decree of a Pope, we truly aspire to become saints!



Sunday, November 5th the Knights of Columbus will be hosting a biscuit and gravy breakfast.


