Fr. Totton's Desk

Merry Christmas! The Sunday within the Octave of Christmas is accorded to the Holy Family of Nazareth. Of course, it's a natural celebration as we see the tenderness of the Holy Family displayed in our church during this Christmas Season. As we ponder this Mystery, there is a slight tension between the reality of family life and the ideal presented by the Holy Family. The Holy Family, for example, is composed of the Incarnate God and His Immaculate Mother, with St. Joseph, a holy and upright man, though, like the rest of us, subject to sin. One may joke, therefore, that if anything goes wrong in that home, the blame lies entirely with Joseph. Our own families, however, are composed entirely of human beings subject to sin (original sin with its attendant *concupiscence* and actual sin)! Nevertheless, we should not underestimate the healing power of God's Grace given us in the Sacraments. Therefore, when we, as a family, fall short of the ideal of the Holy Family, we should not despair. Instead, let us return to the source of Grace – the Infant Child in the manger who seeks to share His Divine Life with us through the Sacraments of the Church. I encourage you, especially this weekend, to reflect upon your own experience of family life – your "family of origin" (parents, siblings...) or your "family of vocation" (spouse, children...) and how it, in some way reflects the Holy Family of Nazareth. In His recent letter on the Family, Pope Francis encourages the Church to accompany families, especially the marginalized those who are experiencing difficulties in family life. 
