I will Give you Shepherds After My Own Heart

The mid-summer week we have just observed is one of my favorites when considering the saints whose lives are held up as inspiring examples of holiness in our world. On July 31, we celebrate the Feast of St. Ignatius of Loyola. While recovering from a combat wound and nursing his own vanity, he unexpectedly fell in love with Jesus and was inspired to place himself in the service of the Lord. In his zeal, he gathered about him a group of like-minded young men to form the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), a unique missionary religious order which placed themselves at the immediate disposal of the Pope. The Jesuits did much to bring the Gospel of to the New World – especially to the native peoples of North America. On August I, we celebrate the Feast of St. Alphonsus Ligouri, a successful Neapolitan lawyer who left the practice of law to answer a call the priesthood. He went on to found the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (Redemptorists), a religious order which took upon itself the task of preaching God's mercy, especially to the most impoverished of people. He was renowned for his writings on moral theology, which he described simply as "The practice of the Love of the Lord, Jesus Christ." Eventually, he was chosen as bishop of Sant'Agata dei Goti, where he sought to reform the local church and spiritually rehabilitate the clergy and lay faithful. Finally, on August 4, we celebrate the Feast of St. John Vianney, The Curé d'Ars. He was raised in a France which had been ravaged by revolution and was later drafted into Napoleon's army for war against Spain. When he finally entered the seminary, he was considered a "late" vocation and had difficulties with his studies because his earlier education had been interrupted. Eventually, he was ordained a priest and sent to care for the smallest, most out-of-the-way place the bishop could think of – the tiny village of Ars! For 41 years he toiled tirelessly among the inhabitants of that tiny village and it's surrounding farmland and subsequently developed a reputation for holiness which echoed well beyond the borders of France and even across the sea! Pilgrims would travel for days and even weeks to have a few minutes of his time in the confessional or to assist at his simple Mass. He is held up as the patron saint of parish priests. Each of these men answered God's call to holiness and to the priesthood at a particular time and place, and each of them helped to reform the Church and the world of their time primarily through seeking personal holiness.

Recent revelations about the detestable behavior of high-ranking prelates and other very influential churchmen has done much to shake the confidence that many Catholics have in the hierarchy. This latest wave of scandal has implicated those at the highest levels of the Church not only for covering up sinful deeds of priests, but for engaging in deplorable acts themselves. The prophet Zechariah foretold: "Strike the shepherd and the sheep will scatter." (Zech 13:8-9). Our Lord himself, quotes that prophet in warning his disciples prior to his Passion. We should note well this warning in our times. As devasted as we may be by the daily revelations of filth in the Church, we must hold firm in Hope to the prophecy of Jeremiah: "I will give you shepherds after my own heart, who will feed you with knowledge und understanding." (Jer 3:15). As we ponder the lives and example of **St. Ignatius of Loyola**, **St. Alphonsus of Ligouri** and **St. John Vianney**, let us pray that the Lord will raise up shepherds, **true shepherds**, in our day to see us through these troubled times.


