St. John, sometimes called John Cantius, was born in the Polish town of Kanty in 1930. Not much is recorded about his early life, however, he was a bright young man who did well in his studies at the university in Krakow. He earned his doctorate in philosophy and went on to be ordained

and earn a doctorate in theology as well. Saint John deeply cared for the poor, giving everything but only what he needed to survive away. He lived an aesthetic life, but was such an engaging man that he often dined with nobility.
