Merry Christmas! Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. To think that the Holy Family was not fraught with difficulty would be false. So often, we picture them in a picturesque scene and while Jesus is the Prince of Peace who comes into the world, we know that the Holy Family, too had to deal with the hatred of the world. King Herod immediately sets out to the destroy the Infant King with malice and violence. St. Joseph, as St. Matthew's Gospel tells us, has to move the family into Egypt, the place of slavery, for a time until Herod's son comes to the throne and it is safe to return to Nazareth. It was in Nazareth, that the Lord grew from a babe into a child and into an adult—the hidden years, before His ministry for His time was not yet to be revealed to all. For we who live a relatively hidden life, this is instructive. We go about day to day in this time, our time, quietly, allowing the Word made Flesh to take root in our hearts and our actions. Traditionally, Christmas not only has an octave or 8 days of celebration, but is crowned with the celebration of the Epiphany or manifestation of the Lord's Divinity on January 6<sup>th</sup>. In the United States, this is transferred to the nearest Sunday (January 2<sup>nd</sup>). This year, Mary, Mother of God is not a Holy Day of Obligation in the United States. Mass will be offered at 10:00am at St. Ann in Plattsburg on January 1<sup>st</sup>. May God bless us in this new year of grace.
