One of the Catholic Charities' missions is to provide basic needs to families who can't afford essentials.

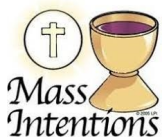

Dear Friends in Christ,

St. John the Baptist meets us today to prepare the way in our hearts for the Lord. This is not an ordinary penance as in the Old Testament, but one in which he asks us to change our way of thinking and doing completely lest we miss the voice of Christ. We need to go into the desert to hear the voice of John first. Advent is like Lent in this way. Just as we follow the Israelites through the desert and then Christ as well, we meet John in the same way. We need to rid ourselves of noise and distraction to hear clearly his voice, and by extension, the voice of Christ. What can we offer the child Jesus this Christmas as a gift through our penance?
