



Dear Friends in Christ,

Lent is upon us. As we journey together during this penitential season, we remember that the desert is supposed to be difficult, arduous lest we forget about the glory that is to come. When we properly prepare with Christ for the Resurrection on Easter, we will be able to experience the joy that come from everlasting life. That being said, the Church today only requires abstinence from meat on Fridays during Lent and fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Traditionally, and for most of the history of the Western Church, fasting was required everyday except for Sundays. Perhaps we could voluntarily deny ourselves where we can to inculcate a better spirit of penance.

There will be no Tuesday Mass at Easton next week. Rather, Ash Wednesday Mass will be at 7am at Easton and 6:30pm at Plattsburg. This is not a holy day of obligation, but one in which we can join together in starting this 40 day journey to re-orient ourselves spiritually by outward works of penance and charity.
