This Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten Season with Ash Wednesday. Mass will be offered at St. Joseph in Easton at 7:00 AM (morning).

Mass will be offered in the evening at 7:00PM at Plattsburg.

The last Sunday before Lent gives us some days to consider the desert that we will be entering into with Christ.
