

Guidelines for Lenten Fasting and Abstinence. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting. This applies to all Catholics aged 18-59, inclusive. One full meal is permitted each day and two other

meals may be taken which, combined, are less than a full meal. Catholics are encouraged to fast on other days. All Fridays, as well as Ash Wednesday, are days of Abstinence. One may not eat meat (beef, pork, fowl, etc.) on these days, though fish (and seafood) is permitted


## **February Prayer Intentions**

- 1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1 800 392 3738( if the victim is currently under age of 18) contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911.
- 2. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Ombudsman, at 816 812-2500 if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.
