

Dear Friends in Christ,

On the Second Sunday of Lent, we experience a foretaste of the Resurrection of Christ in the His Transfiguration among Peter, James and John on Mt. Tabor. It is in this particular mystery where the disciples whom Our Lord brings along are totally flabbergasted by the event that takes place before their eyes—they are almost shaken in fear at the Glory of the Lord.

Jesus shows us the transformation that will take place in His Body in His Resurrection and gives us a foretaste of our own in the midst of the world in which we live. Just like the disciples did, in the midst of the fallen world, we, too can question what it means to "rise from the dead." God offers, through baptism, a life of bodily mortification and the state of grace, and the worthy reception of Himself in the Eucharist, the very same glorification that He shows us in the Resurrection. We need to see this glimpse of glory the second week to keep going. Our penance is not for naught. It is for our sanctification and the offering of it for others. May it be a healing remedy that we, too might experience the Glory of God in our midst and be convinced in Jesus' power to save.
