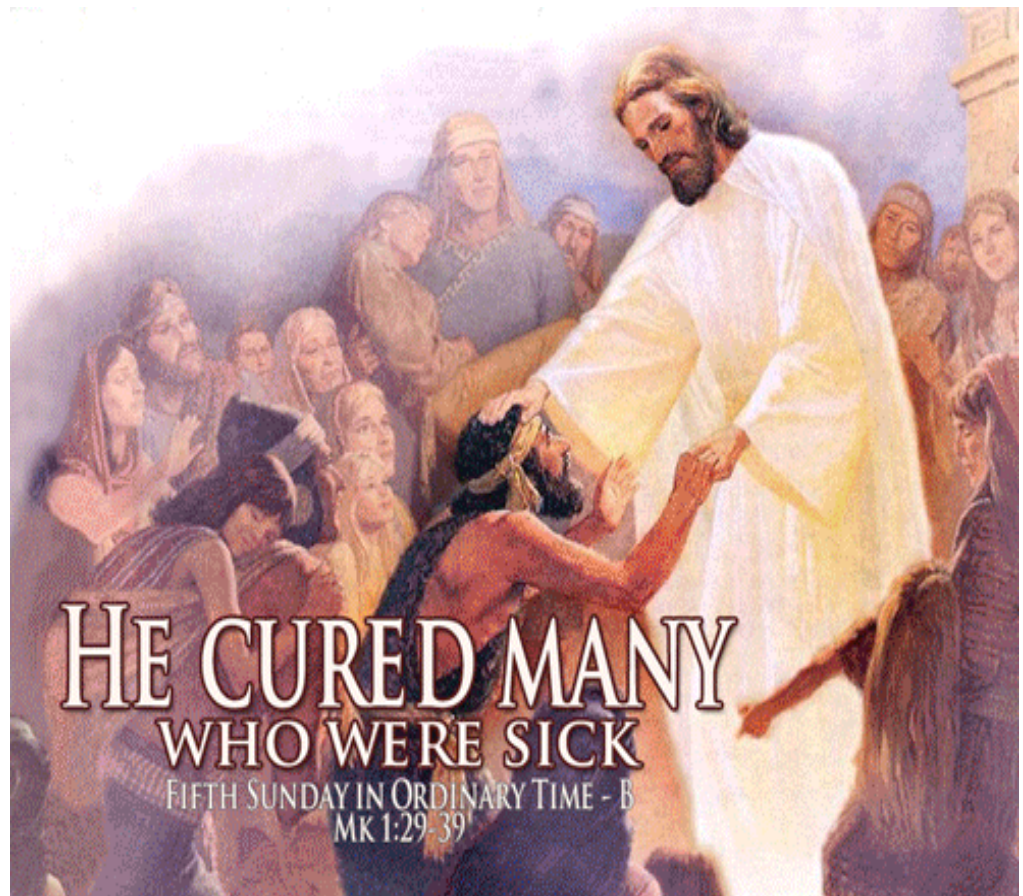

World Day of Prayer and Awareness Against Human Trafficking |



The International Day of Prayer and Awareness Against Human Trafficking (IDPAAHT) is celebrated annually on the Feast of Saint Josephine Bakhita on February 8th, since formally observed in 2015. The primary objective of this day is to create a greater awareness of the phenomenon of human trafficking and to reflect on the situation of violence and injustice that affects so many people's lives. Another goal is to attempt to provide solutions to counter human trafficking by taking concrete actions. The theme of the 10th edition of the day continued on from 2023 (Journeying in Dignity), chosen by an international group of young people involved in the fight against trafficking. This year, the subtitle LISTEN, DREAM, ACT is added to materialize the "Call to Action" commitment made by the international representatives of young people gathered in Rome in February 2023.
