

Dear Friends in Christ,

We now have a week and a half until the beginning of Lent. In the Byzantine (Eastern Catholic/Eastern Orthodox Tradition), each of the Sundays before Lent is gives up a particular food product as a sort of countdown to the grand fast. There is Cheesfare Sunday (the last Sunday to eat dairy) and then Meatfare Sunday (the last Sunday to eat meat products). In the Middle Ages, even the Western Church in Europe subscribed to such a rigorous fast which is why on Fat Tuesday, the tradition was to eat some sort of pancakes—it uses up all of the eggs and dairy!

In the Ancient Calendar, we move our way towards Sexagesima Sunday or sixty symbolic days before the Resurrection of the Lord. There is a peculiarity to the original opening prayer of this Sunday which comes from the time of St. Gregory the Great and invokes St. Paul the Apostle's protection. During the pontificate of Gregory the Great, it was this particular Sunday when the pope and his followers made their way to the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls for protection against the Lombard invaders and begged the Apostle's protection for safety.

In an analogous way, we, too should fly unto the protection of God and not our own human methods first. Lent is a wonderful time to learn once more to rely on the grace of God, to search for His voice in our lives, to fly unto spiritual refuge in His arms and not our own fear. Jesus heals Peter's mother-in-law today in the Gospel and "everyone searches for Him." May renewed search begin now for He is the fount of salvation.
