



Dear Friends in Christ,

In the ancient Roman Calendar up until 1969, we had another liturgical season called "Septuagesima." Having celebrated the Feast of Candlemas and having had capped the Christmas cycle, we soon began what was known as the Easter cycle. Although it is no longer a part of the Modern Roman calendar, it exists in the Traditional calendar and is a reminder for us to begin to think about Lent.

In this mini-season which lasted only 2 1/2 weeks, purple vestments were worn, and the Alleluia disappeared from Mass. No fasting was required, but it was and is a time for us to begin contemplating the journey in the desert with Christ. Septuagesima comes from the Latin word for 70--this Sunday marking seventy symbolic days before the celebration of the Resurrection. Now is the time to think--what will I offer the Lord for Lent this year? Traditionally, fasting was required from Apostolic times everyday except for Sunday during Lent until just a couple of decades ago. If we find this too rigorous, we might incorporate this form of self-denial into our Lenten week--why not on Wednesdays and Fridays? Septuagesima focused in the Divine Office on the Book of Genesis--the creation account. In the succeeding weeks, we would hear about all of the Old Testament "types" or precursors of the New Adam--Jesus Christ. Next Sunday, would have been Noah, and then Abraham, Isaac, and then Moses and Exodus account for most of Lent. It is in this way that we are able to see how God the Father recreates the world and redeems it in His Divine Son and how we are part of this story--the greatest story ever told!

May we begin to prepare now for a holy Lent and a Blessed Easter.
