Dear Friends in Christ,

In the ancient calendar of the Church going back to the time even before St. Gregory the Great, the Roman church marked the beginning of the penitential season of Lent by three preceding Sundays—Septuagesima, Sexagesima, and Quinquagesima—that is, 70, 60, 50—the logical end being 40 days of Lent. This ancient season of Septuagesima required no fasting per se, but was a visual and liturgical reminder of the Lenten season to come. It is said that it takes two weeks to develop a habit—we should be thinking about Lent these next two and a half weeks before it arrives rather than on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday! There was much wisdom and understanding of humanity in the ancient calendar and for that reason, though it has been removed from the 1969 calendar, we should still use this time as a time of preparation. It is on Septuagesima Sunday that the office of Matins began with Genesis 1:1 (the Creation Account). From here, we would learn of Cain and Abel, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob. It is a bookend to Easter where we will hear once again the Creation account at the Vigil when we celebrate Christ who makes all things new (a real new beginning or Genesis). Let us take these next two and a half weeks to consider seriously the journey we have before us. Let us not fall asleep, but be awake and prepared. It is with these two weeks of mental and spiritual preparation that we can make Lent this year a fruitful Penance.
