Dear Friends in Christ,

As now we are one week closer to Lent, I'd like to briefly explore the themes in the Divine Office for Sexagesima Sunday, now *sixty* symbolic days before Easter. Now, for those of you reading who did not read last week's reflection, I'm talking here about the ancient calendar of the Church and in particular, the pre-Lenten season of Septuagesima which will help us to spiritually prepare for a good Lent. The point is that if we begin to contemplate Lent now, it will be more fruitful this year. As the Church gave us the Creation account in Genesis last week, we now move to Cain and Abel. We will then hear about the Flood, the tower of Babel. In addition to the Fall of Adam and Eve, even these are types or precursors to revelation of Jesus Christ Himself. Christ, too will be murdered. He will gather all of creation into His ark, the Church, for salvation against the flood or evils of the world. The Holy Spirit will appear at Pentecost and instead of there being a multitude of languages, all will speak/hear intelligibly their own from others who don't. God re-orders all things through the resurrection of His Divine Son. We begin in Genesis, because Genesis means beginning and a life through Baptism in Christ is a new beginning for all of us.
