

GUIDELINES FOR LENT

Fasting and Abstinence.

Ash Wednesday and
Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence

This applies to all Catholics aged 18-59, inclusive. One full meal is permitted each day and two other meals may be taken which, combined, are less than a full meal. All Fridays, as well as Ash Wednesday, are days of Abstinence. This applies to all Catholics aged 14 and older. One may not eat meat (beef, pork, fowl, etc.) on these days, though fish (and seafood) is permitted.

On this Sunday before the beginning of the Lent, we are exhorted in several ways to prepare ourselves. Whether in the Gospel today which calls us to charity and a coherence between what we say and what we do and how we live, to even what the Traditional readings call us to do for Quinquagesima Sunday—which is, to meditate on the precept of charity and to be ready to follow the Christ all the way to Jerusalem.

To go up to Jerusalem in the mind of the disciples is something that they cannot grasp, cannot understand. They cannot comprehend the suffering Savior; their eyes are closed and honestly, so are our eyes as well. When we begin Lent on Wednesday, we embark on a journey and it is a journey that leads to the Hill of Golgotha all through Jesus' bloody Passion and Death. Without the eyes of Faith, our penance is meaningless. Lent is about embracing the cross of Christ that we might experience the total re-ordering of our souls and bodies to be like His Risen Body. The effect of our penance is a foretaste of what is to come—absolute freedom and no attachment to this world, but only to God Himself. As we begin on Wednesday, let us spend these days being re-ordered by God's grace and accompanying the Lord in the desert.

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence from flesh meat. Fasting is obligatory for those over the age of 21 until 59 and abstinence is obligatory for those over the age of 14. Fasting means one full meal a day with two lesser ones permitted as long as they do not add up to full meal.
