

<u>crayon@omdbusmankcsj.org</u> if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

Sometimes we, too "work all night without a catch." The Lord's message to us today is that we simply cannot do it on our own. A lot of times, I think we have it reversed—that God "needs" us. He doesn't "need" us. He wants us! Big difference! He wants us to have salvation because He loves us. What that turns into is that we don't need God. We can do it on our own. We naturally, because of Original Sin, don't like to be humble. When Our Lord encounters the His chosen disciples, that's exactly what they say—about fish—but it applies to the life of grace as well. Grace is a gratuitous gift given by God to us for our salvation. We can reject the grace of God as well. When Peter finally realizes this, He asks Jesus to depart from him. It was that realization that Peter had of his own unworthiness that finally he allowed the grace of God to pierce through his own stubbornness. When we humble ourselves before God, we allow Him to work through us and in us. When we decidedly are defiant and childish, throwing our tantrum, we will catch nothing.
