

Dear Friends in Christ,

When Our Lord asks Peter, Andrew, James and John to follow Him, little did they know what would become of their lives. Peter--petros--the rock of the Church which Christ would find. His life would include denying Christ three times, being forgiven. Peter would die in Nero's circus for his Lord being crucified upside down, not finding himself to be worthy enough to die as His Savior did. St. Andrew would die in much the same way--crucified on what is called a saltire--or an X. St. James the Greater, one of the sons of Thunder who shows his ambition and his temper is zealous for the Messiah after being called to discipleship. He would eventually be beheaded in Jerusalem by Herod Agrippa, his accuser, according to tradition, being converted by his martyrdom. Finally, St. John the Evangelist, is the only apostle not to die a "red" martyrdom, but rather lives out his days caring for he Blessed Virgin who had been entrusted to Him by Christ and founding a Church in Ephesus. He dies a "white" martyrdom of persecution and exile.

All of the Apostles have one thing in common--they had the gift of faith and perseverance. They did not know what it would mean to follow the Messiah when they were called, but they accepted the call. Each of us are much the same--we do not know how our lives will end on this earth; but we we believe in the promise that Christ has give to those who are faithful until the end--eternal life in the Kingdom.
