

Dear Friends in Christ,

The ancient Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord is upon us. While it was always and everywhere celebrated on January 6th since the first few centuries of the Church, in the United States, in our time, it is celebrated on the nearest Sunday which is today. The Feast of the Epiphany in the Eastern Church was actually more about the Baptism of the Lord and the blessing of water; this is where Jesus shows forth His Divinity in the form of a Theophany, or a manifestation of God. The voice of the Father, the Son rising from the waters, and the Spirit hovering like a dove.

In the West, we began to associate this Feast of the Church with the Three Kings—how each gift manifests Christ's mission in a different way and most especially, His Divinity. One of the customs that grew out of this imitation of the Three Kings' adoration of the Lord, was to invite the Lord's blessing on one's home by writing over the lintel of the door the year interspersed with three letters either for the Three Kings or asking Christ to bless the house. This year, chalk will be provided for you to take home and invoke the Lord's blessing on your house. It looks something like this:

20+C+M+B+21

Either CMB means Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar (the names of the Three Kings) or Christus Mansionem Benedicat (May Christ bless this house). Either way, we invite God's blessing upon our lives in this new year of grace and especially the attitude of adoration towards the King of Kings in our home.
