Dear Friends in Christ,

This Sunday, we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord wherein Jesus enters into the waters of the Jordan to sanctify them. As Jesus' name means "God saves," It is also the same name as Joshua in the Old Testament. When Joshua leads the Chosen People into the Promised Land, he leads them over the River Jordan where, in a similar way to the passage of the Chosen People over the Red Sea, the water is parted for the Ark and the priests who carry it. In a typology that is fulfilled, we also have the Spirit of God hovering over the head of Christ like a dove. In the book of Genesis, the dove is the animal that appears to Noah signifying peace and the end of the great deluge or destruction of the world by water. Now, through this washing sin is destroyed by water which is now sanctified by the Godman. And for that, we know that it has transformed us as baptized Christians; that by Divine Filiation, we are made in this sacrament like the Divine Son in Whom the Father is well-pleased. Grafted onto Christ, let us live lives worthy of the grace we have received.
