

Dear Friends in Christ,

Please welcome Fr. Simon Njuguna, an Assumptionist Missionary from Boston this Sunday. Please take a second collection for him.

In today's Gospel, Our Lord tells His disciples to go out with very few things. Why? The only thing of worth they are supposed to bring is the Gospel itself. And, if people are not willing to accept the truth of the Gospel, the Apostles are to leave, shake the dust from their sandals and not return. Many would say, "That doesn't seem like something Jesus would do. That's soooo Old Testament!" It's not fuzzy or fluffy. It's not nice.

The saving power of the Gospel is offered to all peoples. We are invited to live a moral and virtuous life. We are invited to receive Holy Baptism, to confess our sins, to receive the Eucharist worthily, to live the Gospel with our neighbor. No one, not even God, forces us. He only and always offers us the grace to live the life of Christ within us, but we are never forced. When we hear many of the challenging parts of the Gospel—the commandments, the Law of Charity and sacrifice, the cross, the teachings of His Church, we can be tempted to walk away. Instead, when we are confused or in initial disagreement, we should invite the voice of the Apostles in our lives that we may learn, that we may grow in understanding of the teachings of Christ and His Church, and that we may live faithfully. We have an obligation to not be ignorant of the teachings of our church. Jesus bids us to invite the Apostles in our door that we might have peace in our houses.
