Dear Friends in Christ,

After Luke's version of the Our Father, Jesus talks about a man knocking on the door of his neighbor at midnight to ask for a loaf of bread. For you and me, that would be annoying, but it wouldn't be much to go to the kitchen, go back to the door, and give a piece of bread. In an ancient house, such as this one, the man would've had to climb over his sleeping family and probably wake everyone up just to get to the door. Obstacles in life may seem insurmountable at times—perseverance is what we are asked to do. Jesus then extrapolates this human narrative with persistence with God and we learn that God Himself doesn't give scorpions or snakes when we ask for something good. Because of the disappointments in our own lives, we can often project onto God our experiences of failure. God is not like this. It doesn't mean that everything that we pray for may be good for us, though. When we knock, when are persistent not our own abilities, but we are dependent upon God, there is a sense of peace there knowing that the Father we ask will provide.
