Dear Friends in Christ

It may not seem like God's grace is sufficient. It may seem that we will hunger forever sometimes. Yet, one thing is always in superabundance, if we dare to follow Jesus up the mountain and recline with Him. We would first have to realize Who He is. And after climbing the proverbial mountain with Christ, we will hunger and thirst in the proper way. We will think there is nothing to eat or drink. And from the very little that we do have, Christ will take what we offer, bless it, break it, and there will be an abundance.

The miracle of the loaves and fishes so close to the Passover Feast indicates a foreshadowing of the Holy Eucharist and also that God takes the very little that we offer, and by His grace, transforms what we offer into something supernatural. The very simple elements—wheat ground and baked for bread, grapes crushed and fermented for wine—are transformed by the Word Himself. And these elements, our supernatural food, not only nourishes us physically, but unto the next life. Let us climb the arduous mountain with Christ. It is there that we will suffer, but will learn to keep our eyes and hearts fixed not on ourselves, but on the glory of what is on top of the mountain.
