

Dear Friends in Christ,

I'd like to wish everyone a happy and safe Independence Day! May we be moved to pray for our nation and our leaders. When we encounter Jesus in the Gospel this weekend, we could think of the old adage—familiarity breeds contempt. Because those around the Lord were with Him before He began His public ministry, they were cynical and had no faith in what He could do or in who He really was and is—the Son of God. We can see ourselves in this very same situation—we have grown up around religious items, perhaps the Church building, the Holy things that are here and most importantly, the Lord's Presence in the Most Blessed Sacrament and we can take them for granted. We can, with great familiarity, begin to treat our relationship with the sacramental life of the Church as something altogether warmed over, passé or simply normal without any sort of extra thought. The great mystery of the Incarnation of the Lord seen with the eyes of Christian Faith should prompt and challenge us to view the world differently and to view what we see at Holy Mass differently. For if we see things supernaturally with the virtue of Faith, our eyes will truly be opened. And we will not "take offence," as the onlookers did in todays Gospel at the teachings of the Lord or His Church, but rather have our eyes, our ears and our hearts open to receive the grace He desires to give us for our conversion.

You are cordially invited to participate in our St. Ann Day festivities on Sunday, July 25th. We will have a High Mass at 2:00PM followed by a procession throughout the town of Plattsburg with a relic of St. Ann with our parish picnic beginning at 4:00P.M. Yes, it will be hot. Yes, it will require some discomfort in the summer heat to walk (if we are able), but it is in doing something that we show in a relationship what we believe and it is by doing that our belief is intensified, memories for children are built, and great fellowship follows after rendering praise to God. The parishioners of St. Ann and I extend a warm welcome to anyone from St. Joseph in Easton that would like to enjoy a sacred experience followed by some food, fellowship and fun.
