June Prayer Intention Pope Francis

We pray for Christian families around the world, may they embody and experience unconditional love and advance in holiness in their daily lives.

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we celebrated last week the Solemnity of Pentecost and the manifestation of the Holy Spirit in tongues of fire to the Blessed Virgin and the Apostles, it is now that we celebrate this Solemnity of the Holy Trinity added in the Middle Ages to the liturgical calendar. It is here on this day, that we can see God finally for who He is—in fullness of His Divine Revelation through His Son, Jesus Christ. In our nominalist world where we can be tempted to view things or people simiply in terms of categories where we get to the choose the genus; in other words, reality resides in whatever we say it is or in whatever name we give to it rather than something outside of us that we are receiving according our ability and capacity, we can do the same to God. We can see God's name as a nominal or culturally-bound series of labels from human origin. In reality, God tells us who He is—three distinct persons in one God. These persons are not "parts" of a whole. Each are distinct from one another, but not in essence—they are all coequal. Father is not a name that we throw around—it means that God is Creator, Provider, Protector. God is Son because He, by His very essence, must love another. And God is Holy Spirit because the Spirit is the bond of love between the Father and the Son. It is in this ineffable mystery that we come to know in exactly Whose image we are created.
