Why does the Lord speak in parables? Parables are supposed to entice our intellects unto contemplation for the truth that is being offered. If God revealed Himself all at once, we would not be able to withstand it for He is infinite and we, finite. God, in the end, wants us to want to love Him, know Him, serve Him. He doesn't always come out and readily tell us what we're supposed to do, but rather provides for us a parable that we might contemplate what we're supposed to be, what we're supposed to do, and come to that conclusion by cooperating with Him and the graces He offers. Sometimes, we are not ready to hear the truth directly, lest we reject it; it needs to be explained to us in another way so that we ruminate over it and come to love it. As we now make our way through the Tempus per Annum season or Time through the Year (green vestments), we will hear the miracles and the works of Christ along with His parables. It is a time of contemplation and a time to further our relationship with the Redeemer.
