Starting July 1, many families in this diocese will have a new opportunity to send their children to Catholic schools. The MO Scholars K-12 Scholarship Program provides financial assistance to new families wishing to send their children to Catholic schools. Families who qualify will be able to apply for a scholarship to attend one of our Catholic Schools in St. Joseph, and donors will be able to receive special tax credits for their donations. Incoming kindergarteners and first graders who meet the income threshold are eligible to receive scholarships. Dear Friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate the External Solemnity of Corpus Christi which has its origins in the 13th century. During this period in Church History, we find that there was an increased devotion to adoring the Blessed Sacrament in an *ostensorium* or what is commonly called a monstrance. Because the faithful did not receive Holy Communion with great frequency in most of Western Europe, there rose a right and holy fervor to adore the Sacred Species with even a greater reverence. It is in this century as well that we experience in the Roman Rite of Mass the elevation of the Sacred Host at Mass for the faithful to adore after the consecration. God brought great good out of this period in Church History in the form of public veneration of the Body of Christ. St. Thomas Aquinas writes the hymn *Pange Lingua* of which the last two stanzas are the more commonly known *Tantum Ergo Sacramentum* sung at every Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Today is a great day in the Church's liturgical year to reflect on our comportment in the midst of the Divine Presence. How do we treat the Church building that houses the Lord's Presence? Do we speak at normal volume, have worldly conversation without any care for His Presence? Or do we comport ourselves differently in front of the Tabernacle? How do we receive the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament? Do we receive Him free from mortal sin? Or do we not examine our consciences and receive Him out of habit or custom instead of with great devotion? Do we really believe that every particle of the Sacred Host is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ? Or do we treat It as common food? These are things to contemplate as Catholics living in a post-Christian age. Eucharistic devotion and belief as at an all-time low. What are we doing to properly influence our brothers and sisters in Christ by our comportment? When we show proper devotion, it inspires others. Let us love the Lord in His Divine Presence not only by what we profess, but by how we receive Him.
