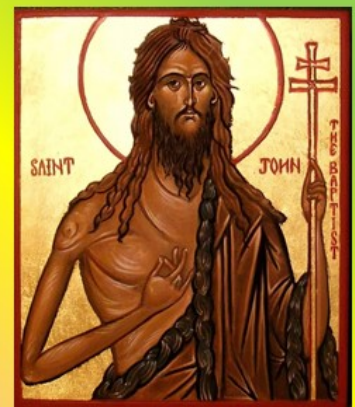
June Prayer Intentions
