

Dear Friends in Christ,

The readings for the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time cause us to think of the theme of "encounter." Whether its Elijah and Elisha or Jesus Christ and His disciples that He calls with the simple words, "Follow Me." Whenever the Lord calls someone, there are a couple of discernible responses. Either the person, like Matthew, drops everything immediately and follows Him. Either they are completely ignorant, ungrateful and have no idea to Whom they're speaking. Or we have this middle way where the presumptive disciple has an idea who Jesus really is, but simply cannot bring himself to leave behind his former life. To literally put one's hand on the plow and not turn back. When we look into the eyes of Jesus Christ, when we truly encounter Him as He is, we will not desire any longer to go back to the way things were. That's precisely the point. As Catholics today, we can often fall into 'cultural Catholicism." That is, we were baptized as infants, this what my parents did, I was raised this way, I've never really thought much about it or the practice of my faith is routine. As the Church declines in numbers, this phenomenon of cultural Catholicism is becoming less prevalent. Nonetheless, we can still have that attitude. The attitude of, "I've learned all I need to know." "I don't feel comfortable going any deeper." Really, what we fear is the cost. To follow Christ doesn't have a price, for it costs everything. As Cardinal Sarah once titled his famous book, "God or Nothing," that is the point that Jesus is trying to get through to those who He calls. We cannot afford to have our lives and then Jesus on the side. He defines who we are. When we truly encounter the Living God made Flesh, we shouldn't desire to go back to the way things were for He gives us a new way of being. He defines where we are going and what we are called to do and be in this life. And when we see it this way, our Faith becomes much more than a routine or an inane custom, it becomes the lens through which we view all things. To follow Jesus Christ means that we push forward, our hand steady on the plow, and we don't turn back.

This weekend begins our Sermon Series on the Nature of the Church. The topic this weekend is, "What is the Church?" Next weekend's topic will be on Christ as Head of the Church.
