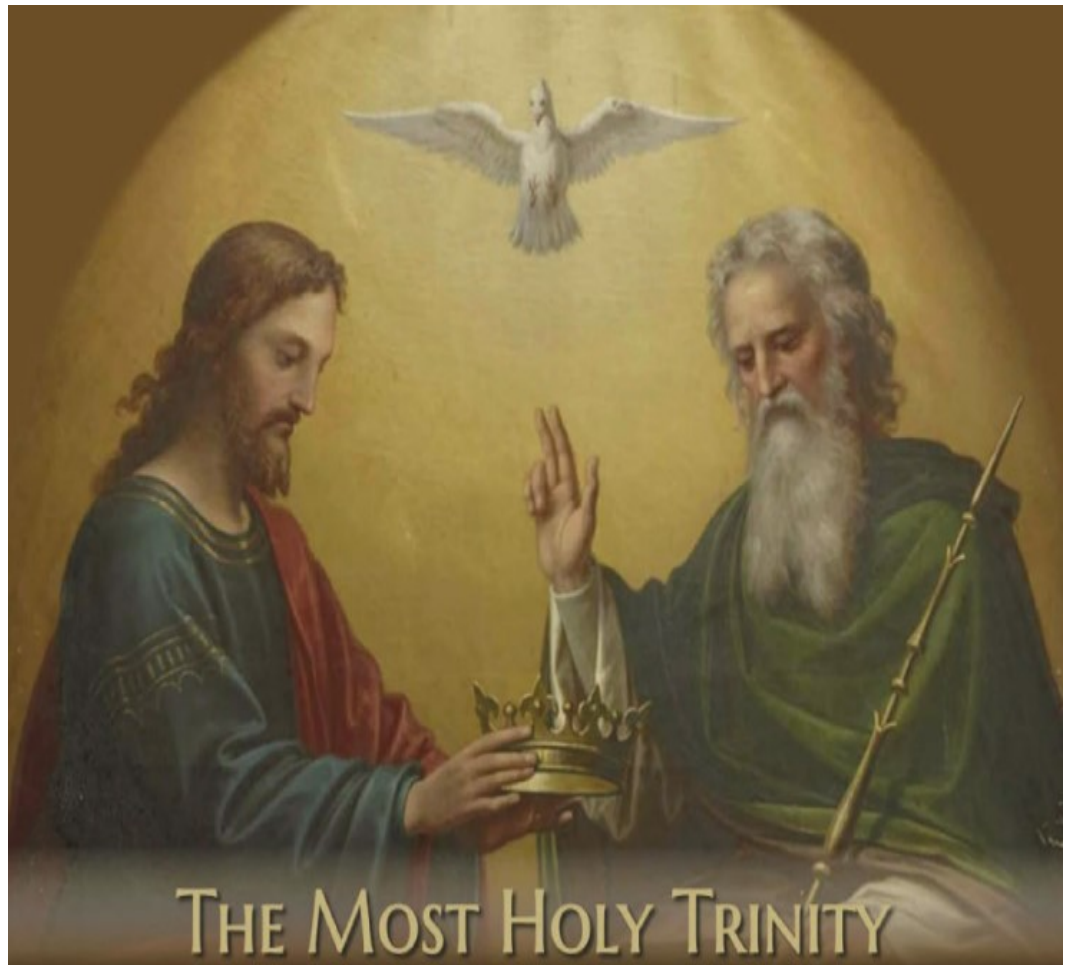

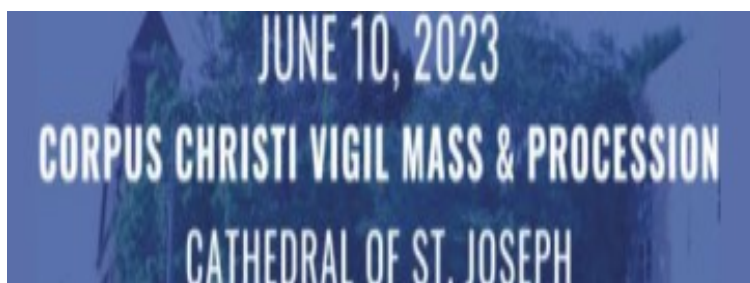

Servant of God Julia Greeley was born into slavery in Hannibal, MO. Julia did not know her own birthday and exact age or the full names of her parents. It is thought she may have been born around the year 1840. She was freed from slavery in 1865, 2 years after Abraham Lincoln passed the Emancipation Proclamation of 1863. After being freed from slavery she eventually landed in Denver, CO working a variety of jobs and caring for the city's poorest residents. In 1880, Julia converted to Catholicism at the Sacred Heart Church in Denver. She became an active member of the Secular Franciscan Order in 1901, committing her life to live simply, love God, and think of all people as her brothers and sisters. She attended daily Mass, always sitting in the front left pew. Her parish priests adored her and fervently defended her from any racist comment made by affluent white folks who took offense to having a black woman sitting in the front of the sanctuary for Mass every day. Servant of God Julia Greeley, Denver's **Angel of Charity**, spent her life serving the poor with a special devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and a love for children and praying for the city's fire fighter



You are invited to join Vicar General for Administration and Chancellor Fr. Kenneth Riley for the Vigil of Corpus Christi Mass and Procession. The Procession will begin at the Cathedral of St. Joseph (519 N. 10th Street) following 5 PM Mass. The Procession will walk the half mile to the Pro-Life Shrine of the Immaculate Conception (501 S. 10th Street) and return to the Cathedral. We hope many altar servers from our area churches are available to attend Mass and/or walk in the Procession. Those at Mass are going to process in with Fr. Riley, priests, and Mass servers. All who attend the Mass/Procession are asked to arrive in cassock/ alb/surplice. All First Communicants from the area are encouraged to wear their dresses and suits for Mass and/or the Procession.
