Dear Friends in Christ,

The Solemnity of Pentecost is one of the principal feasts of the Church's year which is often overlooked. Since antiquity up until 50 years ago, the Church celebrated Pentecost much like Easter, because the sending forth of the Holy Spirit is the completion of the promise. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, is the efficient cause of our sanctity by baptism which enables us to rise in glory. Pentecost had its own octave or 7 continuous days of celebrating the feast until the close of the seventh day. This meant that one week was celebrated as one day—7 days of creation, Jesus rising on the last/first day of the week or eighth day, has this symbolic value or ripple of effect much like a large stone hitting a pool of water or an echo. We need to be reminded of the importance of this portion of Divine Revelation. Pentecost is 50 days after Easter and the Christian celebration of the manifestation of the Holy Spirit in tongues of fire fulfills the Jewish Feast of the same name which took place 50 days after Passover. It is from here on out that we are literally living in the "Time after Pentecost" the age of the Holy Spirit inhabiting the Mystical Body of Christ, that is, the visible Church as her soul. And thus, He inhabits our very bodies when we are baptized. He is the Church's welcome Guest. As we celebrate this great feast of the Church, let us indeed ask for another outpouring of His grace in our lives that we might live what we have promised.

Donut Sunday Hospitality is today following Mass. Hospitality is built into the life of our faith community for the sole purpose of providing a time and space for adults to meet, visit and get to know one another socially and even begin or maintain lasting friendships.
