

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. As Holy Thursday is a bittersweet day because the joy of the Institution of the Eucharist is mingled with the impending Passion of the Lord, the Church in the Middle Ages in the 13th century instituted this feast. It originally was on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday to keep the Eucharistic theme. Today, it is commonly celebrated on Sunday. In our parish, we are pleased to celebrate First Holy Communion as well. Leo Gordon and Cecilia Mink will receive the Lord for the first time today. Congratulations to the Mink and Gordon families!

Corpus Christi is a time before the rest of the summer begins to celebrate earnestly with great devotion the Great Mystery of Faith that is put before us at each Mass—the Divine Presence of Jesus Christ in the Most Holy Eucharist. At the words of consecration, the elements of bread and wine cease to be, the sacrifice is offered, and the Lord becomes literally present in all of His Risen Glory. We are privileged to receive Him. Let us rejoice today in this mystery, that we may live what we offer.
