From the Pastor's Pen...

This week I would like to resume our review of the names in the Roman Canon (also known as Eucharistic Prayer I). The prayer continues in the following manner:

"In communion with those whose memory we venerate, especially the glorious ever-Virgin **Mary**, Mother of our God and Lord, **Jesus Christ**, and blessed **Joseph**, her Spouse.."

Next week we shall see that this is the beginning of a long list of saints, but it is particularly noteworthy that Mary is the first among all the saints! This is a good time to discuss the place of Mary and the saints in the Faith, for some non-Catholic Christians mistakenly believe that we worship saints. Traditional theology speaks of three terms we should examine in this regard: *Latria* means "worship" and it is the honor we owe to God alone; *dulia* is the respect paid to saints who, by their lives of Holiness reflect God's glory; and *hyperdulia* refers to the unique respect paid to our Lord's mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary, who was preserved from sin from the very beginning of her life, and being the Mother of Our Lord, holds a place of special honor.

We begin this part of the prayer by proclaiming that we are "in communion" (that is, united) with the saints. In fact, every Mass is the intersection of time and eternity, heaven and earth. Therefore, just as we are present at the Sacrifice, so also is Our Blessed Mother, just as she was present at the foot of the Cross. To be reminded of the presence of the saints can help dispel discouragement, for example, when we come to a Mass which, for one reason or another, is poorly attended. We will learn more about these particular saints, and why they were chosen to be mentioned in the Roman Canon, but for now, let us be hopeful that these men and women have been where we are now – and in responding to the call to discipleship, and co-operating with God's Grace – they now reflect the Glory of God in a way which we will only fully comprehend once we have joined them in the Heavenly realm.

In reference to the mention of St. Joseph, it should be noted that this is a very recent addition to the prayer. In fact, it was first inserted into the canon in 1962 during the first session of the Second Vatican Council. Nevertheless, It's inclusion reminds us that the place of the Holy Family (Jesus, Mary, Joseph) is not simply to be consigned to the first thirty years of Jesus' earthly life, but that the same Incarnate Divine Word who offered himself on Calvary was formed in the domestic context of Nazareth where he "advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man." (Luke 2:52). As a footnote, the inclusion of the name of Joseph was accomplished by Pope St. John XXIII, on his own authority. It should be further noted that as a child, "Good Pope John" was baptized "Angelo Joseph Roncalli".
