Dear Friends in Christ,

This annual Feast of the Blessed Trinity whose texts go back to the 9th century, was established as part of the Roman calendar in the 14th century by Pope John XXII. It is fitting that after celebrating the life of Christ from Advent until Pentecost, that now, we celebrate who God is who has revealed Himself through Scripture and Tradition for our salvation. The First Vatican Council taught that man can know that there is One God and that he should worship Him. If man were to reason, he could come to this conclusion by looking at nature. What he could not reason, however, is this mystery of Faith—that God is One God in Three Divine Persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. As Catholics with the fullness of God's revelation to all of humanity, we do confess this mystery of our Faith to be true. It is infused in us at Holy Baptism. Because we are born as fallen creatures, the Blessed Trinity does not inhere in us naturally. When Jesus tells His Apostles to "baptize all nations," He is talking about this sacrament wherein the entire world is to be reconciled with the Father, through the merits of His Cross, and sanctified by the Holy Spirit. The mystery of the Blessed Trinity that we celebrate today lives in us who have received this gift of salvation. And before entering into the long season of Time through the Year, where we meditate on the miracles of Christ and living the Gospel in our lives, we pause to celebrate the source of all goodness—God Himself.
