

Dear Friends in Christ,

Although August 6 is the Transfiguration of the Lord, the readings we experience at Mass today are far more ancient and was actually the celebration of this feast. As Lent ebbs and flows, we go out into the desert and we almost immediately get a glimpse of the Resurrection of the Lord. We need this to keep going on the journey, lest we become weary and turn away because of bodily weakness. In the Transfiguration, Jesus suspends the effects of His humanity for a moment for us to see what He looked like at His Resurrection, most especially with the light called claritas (one of the elements of the resurrected body). It is in this moment that the Peter, James and John cannot stand to even look at Him, for the light is so bright. This is an instructive moment for any of us who claim to be saints or for any of us who claim to "have arrived." The brightness of God's light is so bright that we cannot withstand it in our sinful state.

Lent is a time for purification from sin which is darkness and death. The light of Christ which is shown on Mt. Tabor radiates through what we do not comprehend and bids us to a greater faith in what is to come
