

GUIDELINES FOR LENT

Fasting and Abstinence.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence

This applies to all Catholics aged 18-59, inclusive. One full meal is permitted each day and two smaller meals may be taken which, combined, are less than a full meal. All Fridays, as well as Ash Wednesday, are days of Abstinence. This applies to all Catholics aged 14 and older. One may not eat meat (beef, pork, fowl, etc.) on these days, though fish (and seafood) is permitted.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Each year, the readings for Lenten Sundays ask us to see, as St. Paul says, through darkly through a mirror. That is, it is not exactly clear to us, yet as followers of Christ in the desert, exactly the full glory (which means exposed excellence in a theological sense) of the mysteries. Today, we see dimly the resurrection of Christ in glory through the mystery of the Transfiguration. Easter Sunday will be a bookend to this mystery. In the account of the Lord's transfiguration, He is white as snow; Moses and Elijah are present as well which fulfills a type; Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets. He is both personified because He is the Word of God made flesh. In this extraordinary encounter where Peter, James and John are privileged to witness Christ in all of His glory, we notice that they are speechless and want to build "tents" for Moses, Elijah a Jesus. It is a sort of transcendent, yet imminent experience of God, much like we have in our tent or tabernacle in the Church with the glory of God presence under the appearances of bread and wine.

Our Lord allows these chosen disciples to see who He really is—the Son of God—and to glimpse the glory that will be in the resurrection. This should give us hope as we continue to journey with Him through His Passion and Death. Our Lord has the last word over death and the grave because He is the splendor of the Father.
